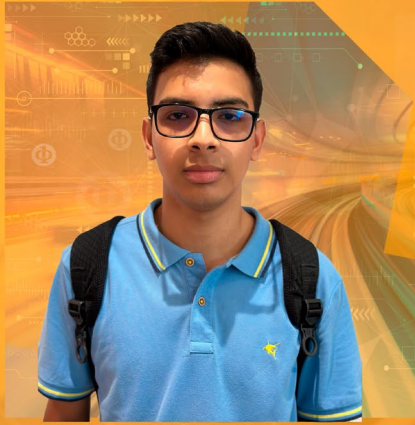

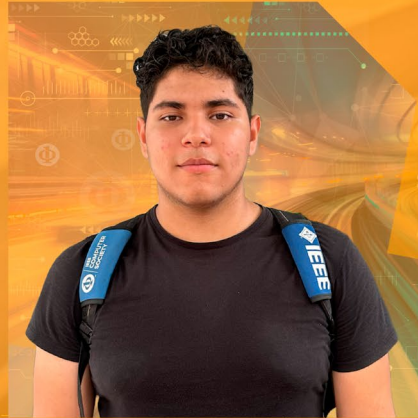

The event featured prominent speakers, including Distinguished Visitor **Dr. Adel Elmaghraby** from the IEEE Computer Society and Distinguished Lecturer **Roberto La Rosa** from IEEE CAS. Additionally, this gathering was part of the prestigious Cátedra Europa event held at Universidad del Norte.

The celebration extended to Universidad Simón Bolívar, where Dr. Elma-

ghraby led sessions, and to an event in Montería, organized by the IEEE TTTT Section's Student Activities Committee (SAC).

IEEE CS Byte2Solution Programming

› IEEE Colombian Caribbean Section Computer Society Chapter Shines in IEEEExtreme 18.0 with Its Programming Team

This year, the IEEE Colombian Caribbean Section Computer Society Chapter, through the **IEEE CS Byte2Solution Programming** initiative, achieved remarkable progress in forming a regional programming team for the Colombian Caribbean. With participants from various student branches within the IEEE Colombian Caribbean Section, the teams dedicated themselves to preparing for programming competitions, especially the IEEEExtreme 18. Programming Competition.

Key Highlights

- › The Colombian Caribbean Section reached a historic milestone with 18 teams out of 30 from all of Colombia, marking the highest regional representation in the competition's history.
- › In performance analysis, this section excelled with a higher average rank and a median rank close to the top, with 8 teams in the top 10 in the country.
- › For the first time in the section's history, there were female participants, emphasizing inclusion and the growth of female representation in high-level programming competitions.
