The Event

The Student Branch Regional Meeting (SBRM) 2025 will take place from October 5 to 7, 2025, at the Hotel Enjoy in Punta del Este, Uruguay. This seaside city is internationally recognized for its beaches, cultural attractions, and vibrant atmosphere.

The meeting will bring together IEEE student branches from across the region to participate in conferences, workshops, networking sessions, and social activities, including the Student Branch Fair, fostering collaboration, knowledge exchange, and professional growth within the IEEE community.

Punta del Este

Punta del Este is one of the most renowned seaside resorts in South America, located on the southeastern coast of Uruguay. Famous for its stunning beaches, vibrant nightlife, and cultural attractions, the city combines natural landscapes with modern infrastructure. Visitors can experience Playa Brava, home to the iconic "La Mano" sculpture, and Playa Mansa, known for its calm waters and breathtaking sunsets.

The city is located approximately 130 km east of Montevideo, Uruguay's capital, and can be reached in about two hours by car along the scenic coastal highway.







Hotel Enjoy

The Hotel Enjoy Punta del Este is **one of the city's most iconic venues**, offering modern facilities, conference halls, and meeting rooms fully equipped for large-scale events. Its prime coastal location provides participants with a professional and pleasant environment.



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Program

Before the Trip

Documentation

To enter Uruguay, participants from Mercosur countries must present a valid identity card, while participants from other countries must present a valid passport. Please ensure that the document is not close to its expiration date. It is also required to bring the SBRM registration confirmation and proof of payment.

Weather and Clothing

In October, Punta del Este has mild daytime temperatures (15–20 °C) and cooler nights (around 10 °C). For conferences and events, the recommended dress code is business casual. For the gala dinner, formal attire is required. A light jacket and comfortable clothing for transfers and outdoor activities are also recommended.

Electricity

Uruguay operates on a 220 V / 50 Hz electrical system. Power outlets can be of types C, F, I, and L, with the most common being the two- or three-round-pin plugs (C/F). It is recommended to bring a universal adapter, and, if desired, a portable charger (power bank).

Money and Payment Methods

The local currency is the Uruguayan peso (UYU). In the majority of shops, hotels, and restaurants, international cards (Visa, Mastercard, American Express, etc.) are accepted. US dollars are also accepted in larger supermarkets, hotels, and some restaurants. When paying with a foreign card, a partial VAT (Value Added Tax) refund is usually applied at the point of sale. It is advisable to carry some cash for taxis, buses, kiosks, and small purchases, as not all places accept cards. ATMs from the RedBROU and Banred networks allow withdrawals in Uruguayan pesos with international cards, though fees vary depending on the issuing bank.

Connectivity

Uruguay has three main mobile operators: Antel, Movistar, and Claro, offering prepaid SIM cards available at airports, the Tres Cruces bus terminal, shopping centers, and city stores. Credit can be added at kiosks and supermarkets. Many public spaces (bus terminals, squares, some buses) provide free Antel Wi-Fi, though quality may vary. Hotels and the event venue will provide stable Wi-Fi. If your phone supports dual SIM, it is advisable to use a local SIM card for data while keeping your own for calls or WhatsApp. International roaming also works, depending on your mobile plan, but in some cases it can be more expensive.















Arrival in Uruguay

Entry Points

The main entry point to Uruguay is **Carrasco International Airport (MVD)** in Montevideo, located about **130 km** from Punta del Este. **Direct buses connect the airport to Punta del Este and are the most convenient option.** Some participants may also arrive through the ferry port in Montevideo or decide to stay in the city before continuing to Punta del Este. In these cases, private transport (minivans, vans, taxis) and ride-hailing apps such as **Uber or Cabify** can be used either for transfers within the city or to reach Tres Cruces Bus Terminal for the corresponding bus connection.



Public Transport in Montevideo

Within Montevideo, most people use public buses. The most common ticket is the "boleto común", which costs about **60 Uruguayan pesos (USD \approx 1.5) for short trips** (see: <u>CUTCSA</u>). Other ticket types exist, and locals often use a rechargeable bus card that offers discounts.

Getting to Punta del Este

The trip from Montevideo to Punta del Este takes about **1 hour and 40 minutes** by bus or car along the scenic coastal highway (2 hours when departing from the Bus Terminal).



In either case, bus companies such as **COT** and **COPSA Línea Este** operate frequent services to Punta del Este. Tickets can be purchased online in advance, or directly in **the terminal, which** also features a shopping mall and food court.


Buses arrive at the **Punta del Este (PDE) Bus Terminal located about 1.2 km from Hotel Enjoy** (around 4–6 minutes by taxi or car).

General information

Language

The official language of Uruguay is Spanish, but in Punta del Este many people in tourist areas also speak English and Portuguese.

Time Zone

Uruguay follows Uruguay Standard Time **(UTC -3)**. For example, when it is 12:00 (UTC), it is 09:00 in Uruguay.

Emergency Numbers

911: Police, fire and general emergencies

105: Medical emergencies

Assistance is generally available in Spanish; in tourist areas, some operators may also speak English.

Tipping Customs

Tipping is not mandatory, but it is customary to leave **around 10%** in restaurants if the service was good. Rounding up taxi fares or leaving small tips for hotel staff is also appreciated but not required.

From beaches and sunsets to culture and gastronomy, there is plenty to enjoy!


During your stay in Uruguay, you will not only take part in the SBRM 2025 program, but also have **the opportunity to explore** the country.

For those arriving earlier (Friday, October 3, or Saturday, October 4), it is a chance to enjoy Montevideo or settle in Punta del Este before the event begins.

For those staying after Wednesday, October 8, the following days are perfect to discover nearby attractions or plan a short trip before returning home.

Within Punta del Este

- Playa Brava & "La Mano" sculpture the city's most iconic landmark.
- Playa Mansa calm waters and beautiful sunsets.
- Punta del Este Port enjoy fresh seafood, see sea lions near the docks.
- Avenida Gorlero the main street for shops, cafés, and souvenirs.
- Lighthouse (Faro de Punta del Este) a historic spot with panoramic views.





Nearby Excursions

- Casapueblo (Punta Ballena) an iconic museum-hotel by artist Carlos Páez Vilaró, especially famous for its sunsets (≈20 min from Punta).
- La Barra known for its wavy bridge and lively atmosphere.

Discover Montevideo

The Uruguayan capital combines history, culture, and the contrast of a vibrant city with a coastal lifestyle. Local Gastronomy

A must-try for visitors!

One of Uruguay's **most iconic dishes** is the **chivito**, a hearty steak-based meal considered the national dish of Uruguay. It is most commonly served as **a sandwich with beef steak**, **ham**, **cheese**, **lettuce**, **tomato and mayonnaise**, **usually accompanied by fries**. However, it can also be served "al **plato"** (on a plate), without bread, where the ingredients are arranged alongside fries, salad, and other garnishes.

Explore Uruguay

Asado, UY Barbecue

More than a dish, the asado is **a social tradition**. Beef cuts, sausages, and sometimes lamb are grilled slowly over wood fire, delivering the authentic flavor of Uruguayan cuisine.

Dulce de Leche

This caramel-like spread is a national favorite. It can be enjoyed in countless ways: flan topped with dulce de leche, churros and pancakes filled with it, traditional cakes (tortas), alfajores, ice cream, and many other creations.

Empanadas Criollas

Savory pastries baked or fried, with fillings such as beef, chicken, ham and cheese, or vegetables. **They are a quick and popular** snack available in bakeries and cafés across the country.

Mate & Tortas Fritas

Mate is a traditional herbal infusion and an essential part of daily life in Uruguay. People drink it everywhere. It is often accompanied by tortas fritas, simple fried pastries, especially enjoyed on rainy days.



Beyond these highlights, Uruguay also stands out for its strong Italian culinary influence. We especially recommend trying stuffed pastas such as ravioli and sorrentinos, which are highly popular. You will also find options combined with seafood, adding a coastal touch to the experience.

Estimated Costs & Recommendations

Mobile Connectivity (SIM Cards & Data Plans)

SIM cards can be obtained at Carrasco International Airport or at Tres Cruces bus terminal, both operated by local providers such as Antel. The Antel **prepaid plan** is particularly convenient for short stays, as the **SIM card may be physical or eSIM** and activation only requires a minimum recharge.

Estimated Costs & Recommendations

Physical SIM availability depends on the opening hours of Antel stores. As most of them operate Monday to Friday, Sunday arrivals may face limited access. **Our recommendation is to use an eSIM if the device supports it.** Otherwise, SIM cards may be found at kiosks or convenience stores, and if not, they can also be purchased from Monday onwards in Punta del Este near the venue. **For more information on the prepaid plan, please refer to Antel's online store.**

For participants arriving at Carrasco International Airport, the airport information desk operates 24/7 and provides free Antel SIM cards upon request. Details on other services of interest can be found on the airport's services page, or through its chatbot, where you can receive assistance.

Free Wi-Fi is available for all passengers throughout the terminal.



Buses to Punta del Este depart from the curb outside the arrivals hall, to the right. A seating area is available at the stop.

The airport information desk is located in the arrivals hall.

Bus Services from Airport to Punta del Este

Several alternatives are available to travel from Carrasco International Airport to Punta del Este bus terminal. **Most companies offer similar fares**; the choice depends mainly on convenient departure times and whether the service is direct. Routes with intermediate stops may take around 20 minutes longer.

Private Transport Options

Private transport is available both for **long-distance trips, such as from the airport to Tres Cruces Bus Terminal**, and for shorter transfers within the city. While **generally more expensive than bus services**, larger vehicles such as vans or minivans are practical for participants traveling with substantial luggage, while standard taxis and ride-hailing apps provide simpler alternatives. The following tables present estimated costs according to the type and size of vehicle.

Price variations may depend on luggage allowance, even within the same vehicle category: higher-cost options usually include one large suitcase and one carry-on per passenger, while lower-cost options may allow only one medium suitcase. Ride-hailing services are generally cheaper but may involve a considerable waiting time for pick-up. Please check the details on the corresponding providers' websites.

Estimated Costs & Recommendations

Food References

Food prices in Uruguay can vary significantly depending on the location and type of establishment. Local spots and casual eateries, such as 'tenedor libre' (all-you-can-eat), tend to be more economical, while restaurants in coastal areas or near the beach are usually more expensive. The following table provides estimated references for both ranges, offering participants a general idea of typical costs.

Punta Shopping, located about 5 minutes by car from the event hotel (less than 2 km), is not only the **main shopping center** of the city but also hosts several restaurants, cafés, and fast-food outlets (**Visit website**). In its surrounding area, participants will also find additional dining options ranging from local eateries to international franchises, making it a convenient spot for both shopping and enjoying a meal.

From there, the activity extends along Avenida Roosevelt, stretching towards <u>Atlántico</u> <u>Shopping</u>, where different alternatives are available. Venues, such as <u>Parrilla con Historia</u> can be found, which offers an **all-you-can-eat ticket (USD 30, UYU 1180)**, including unlimited grill, salad bar, a 0.5 L drink per person, and one dessert. Nearby, small stalls such as churro stands and other quick snacks are also present.
